Computers: All students need access to an alternate computer when technical problems arise to avoid falling behind in classes.

NOTE: Windows PCs are required for some courses and programs and recommended for most. Devices such as Chromebooks, tablets and other handheld devices are not compatible with testing software and other course tools and features. Not all tasks or software used for online classes and tests can be done on the mobile app. Macs are not compatible with software used in ACCT, CAD, CIS, CSCI and HIT classes. It is the responsibility of the student to have a working computer available and to have access to a Windows PC, if needed. Science Labs: Not all science labs are taught online. Some are taught at NDSCS-Wahpeton or NDSCS-Fargo. Students must attend all lab dates to complete the class as there are no make-up sessions. Lab kits are required for some online labs and should be purchased from the NDSCS Bookstore at [NDSCSbookstore.com](https://www.ndscsbookstore.com).

Returning NDSCS students who have had a break in NDSCS enrollment of one semester or more complete a Re-Application for Admission. Please allow at least two weeks to complete the application process.

NOTE: Official transcripts from high school (or GED) and colleges must be received before students can register for classes. Please allow sufficient time when requesting transcripts to avoid avoid delays in registration.

Exam Proctors: Some faculty require proctors for online exams. Where it is known, this requirement is indicated but may change without notice. Proctoring fees may be charged at some locations. Some instructors have additional restrictions so be sure to read the information provided in your class.

Entry-Level Requirements: All NDSCS students must meet minimum ACT or ACCUPLACER test score requirements for English (reading and writing) and Math classes. Contact the NDSCS Test Center if you need assistance scheduling an ACCUPLACER test near you.

Tuition and Fees: Effective Fall 2019, all tuition will be charged per-credit and is based on the RESIDENCY of the student.

Instructional fees are charged per-credit and are based on factors such as enrolled credits, class prefix and location of the class (Wahpeton, Fargo, Online). **Online classes will have a per-credit Distance Access Fee** in addition to the per-credit tuition rate. Tuition and fees exclude books and supplies. Costs are subject to change without notice.

Instructional Fees: In addition to tuition and mandatory fees, Instructional Fees help support the particular needs of specific classes. An Instructional fee will be assessed for each credit a student is enrolled in, based on the prefix of the class. Below is a summary of the Instructional Fees for the 2020-21 Academic Year.
