Scott Schumacher
NDSCS
Head Coach

Scott Schumacher enters his 2nd season as the head coach of the NDSCS Wildcats. Overall, Schumacher has been a college coach for the past 23 years, 20 as head coach.

Having amassed over 350 wins, Coach Schu is one of the select few coaches that have lead three different junior college programs to a conference championship title. Each of these programs was ranked in the NJCAA top ten national polls.

The Wildcats set numerous records during the 08-09 season including most wins in a season and a national ranking of 4th. The Wildcats finished the season with a 31-4 record. This included the Mon-Dak Conference championship, Region XIII championship, and a District 11 championship, which led to a berth at the National tournament held in Hutchinson, Kansas, where for the first time in school history NDSCS won a first round game. Schumacher was honored by being named the Mon-Dak conference Coach of the Year and the District 11 Coach of the Year.

He recently completed his second term as a president of the NJCAA Basketball Coaches Association.

Schumacher has seen 58 of his former players move to play Division I basketball.



Gary Garner
Dakota State University
Head Coach

Gary Garner is entering his first year as Dakota State University men's basketball head coach.

Garner collegiate experience is primarily on the Division I and II level. For the past two years, he has served as the assistant coach for Iowa Energy, a team with the NBA Development League. He served as head basketball coach at Southeast Missouri State University from 1997-2006. From 1991-1997 he led the men's team at Fort Hays State University. His 1995-1996 team won the NCAA Division II National Championship, capping a perfect 34-0 season.

That same year Garner was named the NCAA II Bulletin National Coach of the Year and the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Coach of the Year.

Garner also served stints as head coach at Drake University and Missouri Southern University. He has been an assistant at the University of Missouri and Tulsa University.

His coaching career has included multiple appearances at the NCAA Division II Tournament. His Southeast Missouri State team reached the NCAA Division I Tournament in 2000. Garner reached his 300 collegiate win in 2000. His record of 63-2 was the best among collegiate coaches during 1995-1997.



John Shulman
Tennessee-Chattanooga
Head Coach

John Shulman took over as the 17th Head Men's Basketball Coach in the rich history of the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga basketball program on April 23, 2004.

In three of his five seasons (2005, 2008, 2009), Chattanooga has won the Southern Conference North Division title. Two of those years (2005, 2009) saw the Mocs capture the SoCon Tournament Championship and advance to the NCAA Tournament.

Shulman made his mark quickly in 2005 guiding the Mocs to the Southern Conference North Division title, the SoCon Tournament Championship and the program's first NCAA Tournament berth since 1997 – all in his first year as a head coach.

Shulman led Chattanooga to a 20-11 overall record and 10-6 conference mark in that first year. His accomplishments in 2004-05 earned him the Tennessee Men's Basketball Coach of the Year Award by the Tennessee Sports Writers Association.

Shulman's Mocs followed up that performance with 19 wins in the next season and a fourth consecutive appearance in the SoCon title game. The Mocs have appeared in the championship game of the Southern Conference Tournament in five of the seven seasons John Shulman has called Chattanooga home.



Brian Jones
University of North Dakota
Head Coach

Brian Jones is in his third season as the head coach of the Fighting Sioux men's basketball program.

Last season Jones guided the Sioux on a memorable playoff run, leading the team to the North Central Conference championship game for the first time since 2002. UND finished the season with a 15-15 record, a four-win improvement from the previous season and the program's most wins in three years.

Under the tutelage of Jones, senior forward Emmanuel Little earned All-NCC honors for the second straight season.

UND also enjoyed a highly successful year in the classroom, with a school-record and league-high four players earning Academic All-NCC accolades: seniors Josh Doyle, Jimmy Hoy and Tyler Koenig and freshman Derek Benter.

Those same four were also named to the NCC Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll, also the most in the conference.

In 2006-07, Jones' first as a collegiate head coach, the Fighting Sioux went 11-17 overall and showed marked improvement throughout the entire year.

Jones, who prior to UND most recently served as an assistant coach at the University of Iowa, prior to arriving at Iowa, Jones spent the 1998-99 season under Alford as administrative assistant coach at Southwest Missouri State University
