PURPOSE & AWARDS

The North Dakota Indian scholarship program was established to provide scholarship awards to Indian students who qualify through an application procedure. The scholarship program provides awards to qualifying undergraduate or graduate students admitted to any institution of higher learning or state career and technical education program within the state. A student may qualify for an award by demonstrating academic merit, or by demonstrating financial need. Graduating high school valedictorians who meet the eligibility requirements will be automatically awarded a merit-based scholarship for the academic year directly following high school graduation. Valedictorians must re-apply in subsequent years and meet eligibility requirements based on academic merit or financial need.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Applicants must be an enrolled member of a federally recognized Indian tribe and a resident of North Dakota. Residency for each student shall be determined by the institution that student is attending.
2. All applicants must have been accepted for admission at an institution of higher learning or state career and technical education program within North Dakota.
3. An applicant must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.50 for a merit-based scholarship or 2.00 for a need-based scholarship.
4. Scholarship funds are available to students enrolled full-time or to part-time students who will complete their degree requirements in the current term.
5. Full time enrollment is considered 12 credits for undergraduate students and 9 credits for graduate students. Post-baccalaureate students enrolled less than full time may have their award prorated.
6. Award amounts are set by the ND Indian Scholarship Board for fall and spring terms of enrollment. Summer awards will be considered by the Board if funding remains following fall and spring terms.
7. Students participating in internships, student teaching, teaching assistance, or cooperative education programs may be eligible for a scholarship award only if participation in that program is required for the degree and only if tuition must be paid for the credits earned.
8. Awards are limited to the equivalent of six years of full funding beginning in the 2017-18 academic year.

The priority deadline for submitting a completed application is July 15 of each year. Applications received after priority deadline, or that have missing documents as of the priority deadline, will only be considered if funding remains after all eligible applicants as of July 15 have first been awarded.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications must include the following to be considered complete. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure the application is complete and submitted by July 15 for priority consideration.

1. All application materials must be completed EACH YEAR by July 15 for priority consideration.
2. Verification of tribal enrollment (not required if applicant received an award disbursement in the prior year).
3. The most recent transcript showing cumulative GPA (high school or college **unofficial** transcripts are acceptable.) Grade reports will not be accepted.
4. A needs analysis form or adequate substitute received from the college financial aid office.
5. Certification of admittance and ND residency.
6. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

SATISFACTORY PROGRESS POLICY

To continue in good standing a student must maintain at least a 2.00 cumulative GPA, meet the enrollment requirements of the program, and show continued financial need. If a student has at least a 3.50 cumulative GPA, they will automatically be considered under the “merit-based” rules. Students with cumulative GPAs of at least 2.00 but less than 3.50 will be considered under the “need-based” rules and must demonstrate financial need to receive the award. Students who do not meet the enrollment requirements, need-based requirements or merit-based requirements from term to term can lose scholarship eligibility. Grade point averages will not be rounded up.

SELECTION PROCESS

All completed applications received by July 15 each year will be provided equal opportunity. Award priority for completed applications will first be given to valedictorians, then to merit-based and then to need-based applicants, based on the priority selection process.

Any eligible applicant who is not offered an award but whose application was received by the priority deadline will be placed on a wait list for funds which may become available throughout the academic year. Applications received after July 15 will be considered only if all eligible applicants meeting the deadline are awarded and if funds remain. Late applications will be considered in date order received based on the priority funding guidelines indicated above.

APPEAL PROCESS

Any student who has been denied funding or who has lost funding may appeal to the ND Indian Scholarship Board.

1. A student must notify the ND Indian Scholarship Board that he/she is appealing in writing.
2. A description and explanation of the circumstances should be provided with any supporting documentation.

4. The Board will consider the appeal and then contact the student regarding its determination within two weeks after it renders a decision.

SCHOLARSHIP PAYMENTS

Upon notification of enrollment from the school each term, a check shall be sent to the school to be applied to a recipient’s account. The award may be used to pay the cost of registration, health, activities, board, books and other necessary items. To qualify for the spring payment, the student must be maintaining either the merit-based or need-based requirements, and meet the enrollment requirements of the scholarship.
