### • NDSCS Team Reports

- Dining Services ------ Senator Klindt
  - Now that to-go boxes are not being used anymore, Grab & Go is being used more frequently. There will be more things added to the Grab & Go's. Next meet is April 10<sup>th</sup> at 8 a.m. Vice President Larson has joined this committee.
- Management Team ------ Admin. Assistant Warnecke
  - Legislative Priorities brought up with the topic of the library. Summer and Fall registration are very good this year. It is currently higher than it was last year. Discussed the Minnesota North Star Promise and how other institutions within the NDUS system are thinking of putting forward something similar. NDSCS decided that we need to do a better job of promoting what we already have. Next meeting is May 21<sup>st</sup> at 8 a.m.
- Diversity & Equity Team ------ Senator Makuach
  - Discussed how much they have used in their budget so far and how much is left. They ordered more tampons and pads for our dispensers in Fargo and Wahpeton. Pride in the Park is on August 10, 2024, and they will be getting the gold level package that is

worth \$2,500. The Diversity and Equity Team wants to do something for Agawasie Day to represent Diversity and Equity, such as giving out some popcorn bags or another idea. Talked about Safe Zone Selfies for the months of June for Pride Month, August for Pride in the Park, and October for Nation Coming Out Day. They would have workers and students taking pictures with our pride shirts on to compile pictures for a poster to show students how they have a lot of people on campus that are safe to talk to. The ACHA NCHA survey was discussed, and it was found out that NDSCS was one of the best response rates in the nation. There are some students and athletes who are not able to afford higher meal plans and are unable to each more than two meals a day. These individuals are upset even more since to-go boxes were taken away. Someone brought up having rainbow cords for graduation.

- The rainbow cords should be something that is asked about to the students while Senators are tabling. It may not be very popular within our student demographic, but we can look into other colleges and see what they have done in the past year. Next meeting is May 7<sup>th</sup> at noon.

- Made sure that everyone had tabled on time. Next meeting is Thursday, April 11<sup>th</sup> at 3 p.m.
- North Dakota Student Association
  - IAC
    - They went through the bylaw changes and nitpicked through everything. Discussed different marketing for NDSA at institutions. They threw around some ideas but did not decide on anything. Looked at the budget for NDSA and broke down everything to try and see where they could spend more or what that money could go towards.
  - SLAC
    - Lisa Johnson gave an OER update and let us know that they have organized a statewide OER conference and are inviting students to attend. This is in Bismarck, ND on April 15<sup>th</sup>. An ND Higher Education Day was brought up because it would give students and senators a chance to interact with legislators. There was a resolution in Support of Mirroring State Law Pertaining to Medical Marijuana on Campuses. NDSA has been looking for a stance on medical marijuana as an institution. A resolution in Support of Alternative Pathways to Teacher Licensure was created in response to the teacher shortage in North Dakota. This is a way to ensure that student teacher candidates could be hired by the school they are teacher candidates at. They would sign a contract saying they would be willing to work at that school in the position they are a teacher candidate for. A resolution Pertaining to Gun Carry on Campuses was in opposition to open gun carry on NDUS college campuses. This just restates the NDSA's opinion in case something was to change during the upcoming legislative session. A resolution Pertaining to Open Educational Resources was created to help develop action plans for the utilization and implementation of OERs. There are not a lot of OERs available to students and implementing them would push free and paid resources to produce better content. Most OERs are seen in Gen Ed courses, but they are looking to have them available in nursing, business, computer science, etc. A resolution in Opposition to the Expansion of Sports Betting was brought forward as there have been issues with students developing gambling addictions. Sports betting is illegal in North Dakota and there have been some ideas about banning it from NDUS networks. All resolutions passed to the General Assembly. The PAR Taskforce wanted to extend their deadline, but it was decided that it would be better as a special committee so that there would be no deadline.

SAC

- Discussed NDSA recruitment baskets and what could be included in them. For example, pizza cutters, stickers, ice scrapers, frisbees, etc. The Virtual Attendance Program is being abused and was amended. The policy now states that forms must be sent in from head delegates in order to have the privilege of attending or voting online. The NDUS Humanities Curriculum resolution is in support of humanities credits advertised and taught at any NDUS institution. This resolution was sent to the General Assembly. An Attendance-Based Grading resolution is in the process of being written. There was a resolution in support of using AI as a tool rather than solution in classrooms.
- GA
  - There was a first reading for both the constitutional changes and the budget, which will be voted on at the next NDSA. There was a change to the online attendance policy that will be voted on at the next NDSA. The Policy, Advocacy, and Research Taskforce was changed to a special committee so it will not be ending at the end of the year. All proposed resolutions passed. Katie Kemple from UND was awarded Outstanding Officer, Kiara Radke from VCSU was awarded Outstanding Head Delegate. Hayden Larson from NDSCS and Carter Gill from VCSU were awarded Most Dedicated Delegates. Greg Stemens was awarded Student Advocate. Sadie Hansen from UND was awarded NDSA Legacy. The first round of nominations for executive positions was in March, delegates have the chance to be nominated or withdraw their nominations at the UND NDSA.
- Breakout Sessions
  - Discussed the executive positions and how they want more two year students to try to run for executive positions on the NDSA board.
