### 4. Guest Speaker

Kara Gruenberg Associate Professor/Accreditation Liaison- HLC Student Survey

Discussed the HLC Student Survey and the importance of accreditation in allowing NDSCS to provide federal funding to students. The HLC is one of seven independent regional accreditors in the U.S, based in Chicago, and they accredit all types of Accrediation. NDSCS is working on a quality initiative project.

Advisor Heather asked if students were more frustrated that they were not aware of the 3 day finals week, how large is the actual concern, and would students be upset if there was no fall break? • Tech fee: Increase by \$0.50 per credit

Senatoro Hollingsworth seconded. Motioned carried 7-6 with President Hoff breaking the tie.

## 5. Old Business

### College Casino Nights

Heather explained that the NDSCS's Code of Conduct prohibits Senate and CAB from hosting gambling-themed events. Senator Martinson expressed frustration on why NDSCS events couldn't be used with tickets and winning prizes. Bethany Mauch expressed concened on why gambling is harmful for students and why NDSCS shouldn't be promoting gambling. Senator Hollingsworth asked if Heather or a higher-up could send the Student Handbook section of where gambling is addressed. Vice President Maudal expressed frustration about why Alluxillary events are allowed to have Alcohol on campus since NDSCS is a dry campus. Senator Larson stated college students have gambling problems and holding gambling events would make it look like NDSCS is supporting

gambling. Senator Hollingsworth motioned to end discussion. Senator Exe seconded. Motion carried.
