INTRODUCTION

Dear Practical Nursing Applicant:

Thank you for your interest in our Practical Nursing (AAS) Program at **NDSCS-Fargo** beginning Fall Semester 2020!

The Practical Nursing Program is a selective enrollment program and applicants will follow a <u>two-step</u> selection process with *specific criteria for selection* for both steps. Points are awarded for each criterion with applicants being selected according to their total score.

Application deadline for the first step is **August 1**st (beginning Fall Semester 2020) and **December 1**st for the second step (continuation to Spring Semester 2021). The selection committee will notify the applicants of their admission status via email after each of these dates.

Applicants must ensure that all requirements are complete and on file with the Practical Nursing program by the selection deadline(s). Incomplete files will be disqualified from the selection process.

The NDSCS Practical Nursing Program has a two-step selection process with the first step beginning fall semester, following specific selection criteria, and the second step for continuation into spring semester, also following specific selection criteria. There is limited enrollment beginning spring semester and applicants for this step will be selected based on a point system. Once program capacity has been reached, an alternate list will be established, also based on points.

Acceptance to the college does <u>not</u> constitute acceptance into the Practical Nursing Program.

A scheduled visit to the college and meeting with a Practical Nursing Program faculty member is encouraged. It is also highly recommended that the applicant checks in with the program to ensure that all selection requirements have been received prior to the deadline date(s). Incomplete files <u>will</u> not be considered for acceptance.

The deadline for submission of all first-step selection criteria for fall semester is **August 1**st. All applicants will receive notification of their status by **email** and it is the applicant's responsibility to have their current email on file with the program. The deadline for the second step of selection will be **December 1**st. Students will receive additional information about this second step selection during fall semester nursing orientation

1. Complete the NDSCS admission process and submit an official high school transcript and all official college transcripts to the Office of Admission.

High School Transcript (or GED)

The final *official (or in-progress) high school transcript or GED will need to be submitted to the Office of Admission.

College Transcript(s)

College transcripts must be *official and submitted to the Office of Admission. If the applicant is currently completing college courses, an official transcript must be submitted after semester completion. *Information about transfer of courses* can be obtained by emailing ndscs.studentrecords@ndscs.edu or www.ndscs.edu/tes

*Official transcripts are complete records of your educational background and must be sent to the Office of Admission directly from the high school and/or colleges you have attended. Transcripts must be signed by a school/college official and stamped with the official school/college seal. Photocopies/faxes of transcripts from the school/college attended are not considered official. The request for a transcript must be from you.

2. Complete the Supplemental Program Application for Practical Nursing (Fargo).

- **3.** Submit a high school transcript/GED with a 2.0 GPA or higher. If an applicant fails to meet the high school/college GPA of a 2.0, the following requirement applies: they must complete, or be in the process of completing, at least 12 general education courses from the nursing curriculum and achieve a final grade of "C" or higher to apply/begin the program. Submit official transcripts from all colleges attended.
 - * See Step 1 for information about High School/College Transcript(s).
- **4.** Submit official ACT and/or placement testing results to the Office of Admission. Results must meet the criteria to enroll in ASC 93 Algebra Prep III the first semester of the program <u>OR</u> submit an official college transcript with ASC 93 (or higher level of Math) completed.

Higher level math courses would include MATH 102 Intermediate Algebra, MATH 103 College Algebra or MATH 210 Elementary Statistics. Final grade must be a "C" or higher.

5. Complete and submit the **Self-Reporting Course Completion/Grade Reporting** form to the Practical Nursing Program

Self-Reporting Course Completion/Grade Reporting

Complete the form by indicating which courses have been completed, where they were completed and the final grade. *If they are in-progress, indicate IP. If courses are being transferred in as a different Course Prefix/Course Title; access the link available on the form to ensure that the course is accepted as a transfer course. All courses must be passed with a "C" or higher.

6. Review the Essential Functions for Practical Nursing Students (found in *Additional Program Information*) and submit the **Essential Functions Verification** form.

If you cannot meet an Essential Function, please schedule an appointment with the Nursing Department Chair prior to continuing the selection process.

STEPS FOR SELECTION – SECOND STEP (SPRING)

Requirements DUE December 1st. Capacity – 24 students (Fall acceptance is required to apply for spring semester)

- 1. Applicants without a United States high school transcript (four years), will be required to complete English language proficiency exam(s) and meet the benchmark score(s) prior to continuing the selection process. Contact the program to schedule the assessments if this applies.
 - * See English Language Learners (ELL) Placement Requirements in this booklet.
- **2.** Complete the selection process assessment and meet the program benchmark score of **45** or higher. Testing dates and process will be reviewed during nursing student's orientation to Fall Semester.
 - * See Allied Health Selection Process Assessment in this booklet.
- **3.** Submit documentation of **20 hours** of non-paid volunteer/community service hours. Below are some *suggestions* for volunteer/community hours; contact the program for clarification of acceptable hours.

NDSCS ALLIED HEALTH ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS (ELL)

PLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS

English proficiency is required for success as a student in the NDSCS Allied Health Programs, and as an employee in the healthcare field.

Applicants that have <u>not</u> completed **4 years of U.S. high school**, must take the English language proficiency exams (listed below) and **achieve the benchmark score(s)** to apply to these programs.

Testing dates are <u>limited</u> for the MELAB (offered once a month), so it is highly recommended to

begin this process as early as possible. CaMLA can be scheduled after completing the MELAB. Each exam can be retaken once.

Once both exams have been completed, the applicant will receive their scores.

If the applicant achieves the benchmark scores, the selection process to the program can continue. If the benchmark scores are not achieved, one retake is allowed for both exams.

If the benchmark scores are not achieved, it is recommended that the applicant complete the ELL Program of Study. Then <u>retest to meet the benchmark scores</u>. If the scores are met, the applicant can re-apply to the next available selection process to the program.

The TOEFL iBT can also be utilized to fulfill this requirement. *This assessment is* <u>not</u> offered at NDSU or NDSCS.

An <u>official</u> transcript must be submitted to fulfill the ELL requirement. Scores are valid for **two years** from the test date.

If the applicant achieves the benchmark score(s), the selection process to the program can continue. If the benchmark scores are <u>not</u> achieved, one retake is allowed per exam. *The MELAB and CaMLA could be taken for the reapplication process if the TOEFL is not available.

NDSCS ALLIED HEALTH SELECTION PROCESS ASSESSMENT

The program you are applying to requires a selection process assessment. The assessment currently being utilized is the **Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)** by Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI).

The ATI TEAS is designed specifically to assess a student's preparedness for entering a health program. The ATI test is comprised of 170 questions set up in multiple choice format with four-option answers. Questions are designed to test the basic academic skills you will need to perform in class in the areas of Reading, Math, Science and English and Language Usage.

STEPS FOR SCHEDULING TEAS:

Schedule Assessment

Complete the NDSCS College Application process to an Allied Health program. Testers must have a <u>current NDSCS application</u> on file to schedule a TEAS test at this site. **If you need to take a TEAS for a college selection process <u>other than NDSCS</u>, visit <u>www.atitesting.com</u> to find a testing site in your area.

If you are <u>not able</u> to make your reserved testing date, or need to <u>change</u> dates, please contact the program, using the email above, as soon as possible.

Create an Account

Once you have scheduled your test date, you will receive <u>emailed</u> instructions for creating an account with ATI. Your account will need to be created PRIOR to your testing date. Bring your login and password with you the day of testing.

If you have a previous ATI account established, <u>do not</u> create another one. Bring your user id and password with you the day of testing.

DO NOT order your TEAS Assessment from the ATI website. ONLY create an account.

Day of Testing

Arrive 30 minutes prior to start time. Once testing has begun, late arrivals will not be allowed to test and will have to reschedule the assessment.

The examinee should have an ID which is government-issued with a current photograph and examinee's signature and permanent address. If the name and photograph does not match, the examinee will not be allowed to test.

Each tester will also sign the testing roster with their legal name and email address.

Test is payable via credit card by the applicant the day of testing. The current cost of the assessment is **\$65.00** (subject to change-verify with program prior to testing).

Personal belongings will not be allowed at the testing station. Backpack, purses, cell phones, etc. will need to be checked in prior to testing.

Calculators are not allowed. If a calculator is required for a question, one will appear on the testing screen.

Food or drinks are not allowed in the testing room.

A pencil and two pieces of paper will be distributed to each tester prior to the exam. The pencil and <u>both</u> pieces of paper must be turned in at the end of testing for the examinee to receive their score.

The exam allows three hours for completion. Results are available immediately after testing.

Benchmarks

The benchmark for the TEAS test, for the program you are applying to, is listed on the Program Factsheet and is also listed in this booklet. Benchmarks are not the same for all programs.

Benchmark means you must meet this score (or above) to apply to the program.

TEAS Score

You will receive your TEAS score immediately after testing and will also receive a paper copy of your results. Staff will review your score, discuss possible retakes and review your selection file with you. If you wish to meet with a program advisor that day, please schedule the appointment prior to your testing day.

Retakes

<u>One</u> retake is allowed per selection process (maximum of two TEAS within a calendar year). It is highly recommended scheduling your assessment date well in advance of the application deadline to allow time for a retake, if needed. There is a minimum of two weeks between testing dates for retakes.

Previous TEAS Results

If you have already completed a TEAS Assessment and met the benchmark for the program you are applying, you can use the score for this selection process. An official transcript must be ordered and sent to the program via ATI. Go to www.atitesting.com to order an official transcript. *If you completed this assessment at NDSCS for a different selection process, an official transcript does.not.need.com need to be ordered. Contact the program to have the assessment moved into the current selection process.

Version of TEAS Assessment

The current version of the test is **ATI TEAS Test** (Version 6). If you have a previous TEAS test and it <u>is not</u> this version, you will need to <u>retake</u> the assessment. Please check with the program.

FREQENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When is the deadline to apply?

August 1st (beginning fall semester) for the NDSCS-Fargo program. A second selection process will take place at the end of fall semester to continue into spring semester, with selection requirements due **December 1**st.

What does a two-step selection process mean?

The initial selection (first step) will be for beginning the program Fall Semester 2020. Follow the selection process listed in this booklet. There is no limit to how many qualified applicants can be begin this semester.

To continue program into Spring Semester 2021, there will be a second selection process; which will include selection testing, volunteer hours, completion of program requirements (immunizations, etc.) and ELL placement (if applies). For the second step, 24 student students will be selected (based on selection points) to continue into spring semester.

How often do you start a Practical Nursing Program at NDSCS-Fargo?

The NDSCS-Fargo Practical Nursing Program begins a cohort (class) every two to three years (if approved). The program will select this class to begin August 2020, at the Fargo site, and another selection process will <u>not</u> occur until <u>possibly</u> Spring 2023, if approved.

A cohort (class) is offered beginning every Fall and Spring semester at the NDSCS Wahpeton Campus.

How soon will I know if I've been selected to begin the program?

Acceptance letters are generally *emailed* within one to weeks of the deadline date. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure their correct email address is on file with the Practical Nursing Program.

When I receive my notification letter, what do the different status terms mean?

- **Accepted** File is complete with high overall admission score.
- **Conditional Acceptance** Missing documentation for admission file. Example would be final college transcript or waiting for final grades to be posted.
- **Alternate** Means that should an accepted applicant decline their position in the program, an alternate will be accepted in their place.
- **Non-Acceptance** Not accepted in this selection pool; could be for various reasons, including not meeting admission criteria, incomplete file or low overall admission score.

How many are admitted to each class?

There is no limit to qualified applicants accepted into fall semester (first step). There will be 24 students selected to continue into spring semester (second step).

What is the selection process assessment for the second step selection process and how do I schedule a date/time?

The assessment to complete for the current selection process is: *Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)*. Information about your testing process will be reviewed fall semester.

The exam is administered at the Wahpeton Campus. There may be one testing date at NDSCS-Fargo prior to the selection deadline. Check with the program to see what date/time may be scheduled.

Is there a benchmark that must be met for the selection process assessment to apply?

Yes, the benchmark score to apply to the program is **45**. The assessment can be retaken once within one calendar year.

Can I study prior to taking the TEAS?

Yes, you can visit the website www.atitesting.com and click on ATI Store for a practice exam. There are also study guides available on the Wahpeton and Fargo NDSCS Campuses (but cannot be checked out); please contact the program for more information. There is also a study preparation course available from ATI called TEAS SmartPrep. For more information, visit www.atitesting.info

If I have already taken the TEAS can I use that score for my selection process?

Yes, a previous TEAS score may be used if it is a current version. It must be submitted to the program via an official transcript order through the ATI website. Scores submitted by the applicant will not be accepted. Please contact the program if you will be using a completed TEAS for more information.

How long does it take to complete the program and when do classes begin?

The Practical Nursing Program at the NDSCS-Fargo site will be seven semesters in length. Beginning Fall 2020 and graduating Fall 2022.

Are all class offered at NDSCS-Fargo?

Most classes and clinicals will be located at NDSCS-Fargo. There will be some classes and labs that will be held at the NDSCS-Wahpeton campus and via interactive TV. The majority of the face to face classes will be held in the evening hours, with varying clinical hours.

If I am not admitted can I re-apply?

Yes, you may re-apply, and your selection process will begin again. Contact the program to have your file rolled over to the next selection process. This can be done by contacting Sonja Fenske at 701-671-2967 or emailing sonja.fenske@ndscs.edu

*Program selection is both fall and spring semesters at the NDSCS Wahpeton Campus. Selection at the NDSCS-Fargo site only occurs every two to three years, if approved.

Suggested Sequence of Study

For applicants selected to begin the program fall semester, there will be an orientation session with nursing faculty and staff the first week of classes. At the time, students will meet their advisor, review program policies, sequence of study and review the selection process for continuing to spring semester.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS - IMMUNIZATIONS/VERFICIATIONS

Documentation (compliance check) of the following immunizations/verifications by **December 1**st (**unless specified). Students will not be allowed to participate in clinicals unless all requirements have been met. Immunizations, exams and certifications are at the students' expense. Students accepted into the program will receive more information on how to create and pay for an account in the clearing house utilized by the program and how to upload the requirements prior to the deadline date. DO NOT submit these requirements directly to the program.

Health Record Requirements:

- a. documented evidence of Measles, Mumps, Rubella vaccination or Rubella positive titer.
- b. documentation of three Hepatitis B immunizations, positive titer or a waiver.
- c. documentation of Varicella (Chicken Pox) vaccinations or proof of a positive titer.
- d. documentation of Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria & Pertussis) vaccination within the last ten years.
- e. documentation of a negative **two-step** TB Skin Test (Mantoux), QuantiFERON Gold blood test or Tspot. If positive, a copy of the lab report or a clear chest x-ray completed within the last year. This requirement will be a yearly renewal.
- f. *documentation of a flu shot administered during the <u>current</u> flu season. **This requirement will not be **due until October 1** to ensure administration of current vaccination and will be a yearly renewal.
- g. documentation of current Health Insurance.

Certifications:

CPR Certification – American Heart Association BLS Provider <u>or</u> BLS for Healthcare Provider American Red Cross **ONLY**

Background Check/Fingerprinting/Drug Screen:

Federal Background Check will be required

Drug screening

Fingerprinting and additional background checks <u>may be</u> required (dependent on clinical site requirements)

Health Insurance:

Submit documentation of current Health Insurance.

Students will be required to stay current with the above requirements while in the program.

Delivery Methods

Face-to-Face: Wahpeton Face-to-Face: **Fargo Combination

** Fargo cohort is offered on a periodic basis.

This two-and-a-half-year program is available to high school graduates or transfer students who are interested in pursuing a career in nursing. The curriculum is seven semesters and awards an Associate in Applied Science degree in Practical Nursing. The graduate has an excellent opportunity for immediate entry into the health profession and/or transfer to an associate or bachelor's program for nursing. All general education courses are transferable within the NDUS system. There is a two-step selection process with the first step beginning fall semester and the second step continuing into spring semester. Practical nurses have excellent job opportunities, which include employment in hospitals, long-term care facilities, clinics, home health, hospice, schools, and industry,

The first three semesters of the program consist of classroom, laboratory, and clinical instruction at the college and local long-term care facilities. The final four semesters of the program include clinical affiliations in adult, maternal-child, psychiatric, long-term care, home health, and clinic nursing. Classroom instruction is face to face with limited Interactive Video Network (IVN) in Fargo. Tutoring is available at the NDSCS-Fargo Academic Services Center (ASC) for many general education and some nursing courses.

Criminal background checks will be required. A previous conviction may affect clinical rotations and a state board of nursing could deny an application for licensure as a Practical Nurse. If arrested, charged and/or convicted of any felony, the applicant is required to meet with the department chair. A federal criminal history background check will-also be required to test for the NCLEX-PN.

The NDSCS Practical Nursing program is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN), 3343 Peachtree Road NE, Suite 850, Atlanta, GA 30326, 404-975-5000, and has full approval from the North Dakota Board of Nursing, 919 South 7th Street, Suite 504, Bismarck, ND 58504, 701-328-9777.

This program requires access to a personal computer, with a current operating system, capable of completing the assignments required by the nursing program.

**This program is being offered at the NDSCS-Fargo site beginning Fall Semester 2020. The program will not be offered again at the Fargo site until this cohort (class) is complete and another program is approved. The NDSCS Wahpeton campus selects two Practical Nursing classes every year.

Admission/Selection Requirements

Applicants will be admitted to the program Fall Semester (first step) following a selection process completed prior to the deadline date of August 1.

- 1. Complete the NDSCS Application Process for Admission. Refer to the NDSCS website at www.ndscs.edu/admissions for details.
- Complete the Supplemental Program Application for the Practical Nursing Program (NDSCS-Fargo).
- Submit a high school transcript /GED with a 2.0 GPA or higher. If an applicant fails to meet the high school /college GPA of a 2.0, the following requirement applies: they must complete, or be in the process of completing, at least 12 general education credits from the nursing curriculum and achieve a "C" or higher to apply to the program.
- Submit official ACT and/or placement testing results to Enrollment Services. Results must meet the criteria to enroll in ASC 93 Algebra Prep III the first semester of the program OR submit an official transcript with ASC 93 completed with a "C" or higher.
- Review Essential Functions for Practical Nursing Students and submit the Essential Functions Verification form.

Spring Semester Selection Process. Completed by December 1. Capacity - 24

- Applicants without a United States high school transcript (four years), will be required to complete English language proficiency exam(s) and meet the benchmark score(s) prior to continuing the selection process. Contact the program to schedule the assessments if this applies.
- Complete a program admission assessment and meet the program benchmark composite score of 45. Exam can be retaken once.
- 3. Submit documentation of 20 hours of non-paid volunteer/community service hours
- Submit compliance for Program Requirements-Immunizations/Verifications: specific immunizations, background checks, health insurance, CPR

(American Heart Associate BLS Provider OR BLS for Healthcare Provider American Red Cross ONLY) are required and must remain current while in the program. Additional prerequisites (e.g. drug screening/fingerprint, specific state background check) maybe required dependent on site-specific prerequisites for students. All requirements are at the students' expense.

Criteria for Selection - Fall Semester

Selection is based on the following criteria: High School GPA or GED, math placement, most current college GPA (12 credits or more), grades in college level BIOL 220/220L, 221/22IL and MICR 202/ 202L.

Criteria for Selection - Spring Semester

Assessment scores, volunteer/community service hours, compliance with immunizations/verifications, and ELL scores (if applies).

It is highly recommended the applicant contact the program periodically during the selection process to ensure file completion. Incomplete files will not be considered for selection.
