

Students –

To continue to minimize the risk and spread of COVID-19 NDSCS will be providing a **\$100 financial incentive to students who have been fully vaccinated**. Funds being used for the COVID-19 vaccination financial incentive are federal funds.

Eligibility

- **All NDSCS degree-seeking students (full-time or part-time) who are enrolled at NDSCS for Fall 2021 semester and can verify they are fully vaccinated will receive \$100.**
 - The following students are **NOT** eligible: benefitted employees who are taking classes at NDSCS; Early Entry students; Adult Farm Management students; collaborative students whose home institution is not NDSCS; Tri-College students whose home campus is not NDSCS.
- To be eligible, students must be **fully vaccinated** (both shots of Pfizer/Moderna or one shot of J&J/Janssen) **by October 15, 2021**.

Verification/Request Process

- **Students requesting the \$100 HEERF Incentive must complete the [HEERF III Vaccination Verification Request Form](#).** NDSCS Student Health Service and their trained designees will verify the vaccination through the corresponding state health department registry.
 - Students who were vaccinated *outside* of Minnesota, South Dakota, Montana, North Dakota, will need to upload proof of vaccination into the request form. Proof of vaccination may be obtained through the [student's state registry](#).
 - COVID cards will NOT be accept due to fraudulent activity.
- Once a student's vaccination status has been verified, the NDSCS Business Office will be notified to issue the \$100 to the student through their NDSCS account (check or direct deposit). This process could take up to two weeks pending volume.
 - **NOTE:** the payment will be paid directly to the student via direct deposit or check; it will **not** be applied against tuition and fee charges.

Vaccination Information

- Various opportunities exist within the Wahpeton and Fargo communities to get the COVID-19 vaccine for free!
 - Due to Pfizer/Moderna vaccinations requiring multiple weeks between the first and second vaccinations students should plan to get their first Pfizer/Moderna vaccination no later than September 15
