CO-ED TRADITIONAL HALL

Riley

- Located on the west side of the Student Center
- Three floors (1st floor contains staff offices only)
- Air conditioning
- Elevator
- Rooms have two extra-long twin beds that are lofted, two desks, two chairs
- TV lounge and study lounge located on upper floors
- Unlimited access laundry facilities on every floor
- Shares TV lounge/kitchen with Forkner, Schulz and Walton

CO-ED SUITE STYLE HALLS

Forkner

- Located on the west side of the Student Center
- Three floors
- Air conditioning
- Elevator
- Suite set up includes two bedrooms and one bathroom per suite
- Each bedroom has two extra long twin beds, two desks, two chairs
- Unlimited access laundry facilities on every floor
- TV lounge and study lounge located on upper floors
- Shares TV lounge/kitchen with Schulz, Walton and Riley

Nordgaard

- Located on the north side of campus
- Ten floors (nine residential)
- Air conditioning
- Two elevators
- Double occupancy
- Suite set up includes four bedrooms and two bathrooms off a central living area
- Each bedroom has two extra long twin beds, two desks, two chairs
- Closets contain a built-in three drawer dresser
- Unlimited access laundry facilities on every floor
- TV lounge and study lounge located on main floor

FEMALE TRADITIONAL HALL

Walton

- Located on the west side of the Student Center
- Three floors
- Double occupancy and *corner rooms
- Rooms have two standard beds, two desks, two chairs, built-in 4-drawer dressers
- Air conditioning
- Unlimited access laundry facilities on every floor
- Lower level has a game room
- Shares TV lounge/kitchen with Schulz, Forkner and Riley

MALE TRADITIONAL HALLS

Robertson

- Located on the north side of campus
- Six floors
- Double occupancy and *corner rooms
- Elevator
- Rooms have two extra long twin beds, two desks, two chairs
- Closets contain a built-in three drawer dresser
- Study rooms on floors 1-6
- Unlimited access laundry facilities located on lower level
- TV lounge/game room located on lower level

Schulz

- Located west of the Student Center
- Three floors
- Double occupancy and *corner rooms
- Rooms have two standard beds, two desks, two chairs, built-in 4-drawer dressers
- Air conditioning
- Unlimited access laundry facilities on every floor
- Lower level has a game room
- Shares TV lounge/kitchen with Walton, Forkner and Riley

**Corner rooms are furnished for double occupancy and are larger than a double occupancy room. Corner room rates apply.*

LOFTING and BUNKING BEDS

Lofting a bed means using a “lofting kit” to raise your bed off the floor. Bunking a bed means putting one bed above the other. A limited supply of loft kits are rented per academic year on a first come, first serve basis, with a signed rental agreement form. The non-refundable rental fee will be charged to your student account. The residence halls that have lofting and bunking capabilities are Robertson, Riley, Forkner and Nordgaard halls. Walton/Schulz beds are loftable.

Wireless Internet and cable TV access are available in all residence halls. All halls contain kitchens with refrigerator, stove and microwave.
